Access to Care, Coverage, Gains, and Reduced Cost Burden

22 million fewer Americans with coverage and \$772 billion less in Medicaid funding

Weaker protections for those with pre-existing conditions

Higher costs for older, low- and middle-income Americans



Preventive Services, Essential Health Benefits, and More Efficient Use of Resources

Loss of 10 Essential Health Benefits requirement

Greater reliance on charity care and Emergency Rooms for those without coverage

Loss of \$1B/year in prevention funding for vaccinations, tobacco, etc.



Quality of Care and Value-Based Purchasing Models

Loss of ACA's major care coordination provisions

Loss of gains made through the Hospital Readmissions Reduction Program

Reversal of value-based purchasing reforms and quality initiatives



Workforce Gains

35% reduction in Medicare Part B Certified Nurse Midwife reimbursement

Loss of over 1 million healthcare jobs by 2023

Significant loss of RN and APRN jobs
